Wilmington, NC - Is your DIESEL car or truck running on empty? No plans for lunch this Friday? No worries. We'll fill up your tanks...for FREE!

Eco-Collections Systems, Cape Fear Biofuels (CFB Services) and Triangle Biofuels, along with Papa Johns Pizza, invites those with diesel powered vehicles to a one-of-a-kind grand opening where lunch and up to 10 gallons of biodiesel fuel will be provided at no charge.

The open-to-the public event, which will take place this Friday (May 8th) from noon-3:00 p.m. celebrates the opening of a "B-100" (that's 100% biodiesel fuel) solar-powered filling station onsite at Eco-Collections Systems which is located at 3121 North Kerr Ave. in Wilmington. Biodiesel will be on sale once the 500 gallons runs out and after 3 p.m.

Triangle Biofuels Industries, a local refiner of ASTM certified biodiesel, has graciously donated 500 gallons of biodiesel fuel for the event.

Papa Johns pizza will be providing complimentary pizza and Coca-Cola products.

What makes this event even more interesting is that of the refined used frying oil to be distributed at the grand opening was collected locally by Eco-Collection Systems from area restaurants.

"After Eco-Collection Systems recycles the used frying oil, we step in and refine it to produce ASTM special biodiesel at our state-of-the-art facility in Wilson, North Carolina," says Zachary Hamm of Triangle Biofuels Industries, Inc. The finished product is then sold CFB Services and to other local petroleum distributors and cooperative businesses, who distribute the fuel to filling stations across the state.

"This pump will be open to all members of Cape Fear Biofuels as well as other biodiesel cooperatives throughout North Carolina," said Brent Manning, co-founder of Cape Fear Biofuels. "We are proud to be working with Eco-Collection Systems and Triangle Biofuels Industries to grow the distribution of alternative fuels in the Wilmington area."

Most people equate cooking oil as waste. And, if disposed of improperly, has negative effects on our surroundings. However, the technology is now available to turn these "leftovers" into something that actually benefits our planet.
