

NC State University At A Glance

Students

- Largest four-year institution in North Carolina
- Largest number of applications from NC students
- More than 31,100 students from all NC counties and nearly 100 foreign countries (23,730 undergraduates; 7,400 graduates and professional)
- 4,478 undergraduate and 1,929 graduate degrees awarded in 2005-06
- Bachelor's degrees in 110 fields; master's in 110 fields; PhDs in 61 fields; Doctor of Veterinary Medicine
- 100+ national scholars and fellows in past five years

Faculty & Staff

- 1,825 teaching and research faculty; 339 field faculty (*extension*)
- 18 members of the National Academies
- 4th among 16 peers in NSF CAREER faculty awards over last four years
- 5,843 administrative and support staff

Extension, Engagement and Economic Development

- \$1 in State funding for NC State generates nearly \$8 in total income for NC
- 1,200 employees stationed in all 100 counties and the Cherokee Reservation
- 13 off-campus regional research and extension centers, 9 field laboratories, and 15 shared research stations

Financials and Private Support

- Total budget: \$1.01 billion (41% from state appropriations and 14.5% from tuition)
- Total endowment: \$412.3 million for fiscal year 2006
- 3rd in corporate fundraising among public universities
- Achieve! capital campaign reached its \$1 billion goal 19 months early

Research

- \$303 million in research expenditures (35th among public universities, *NSF Research Expenditures 2005*)
- 3rd in industry-supported research in the U.S. (among public universities without medical schools)
- Over 70% of faculty engaged in sponsored research
- Over 2,500 graduate students supported on research and teaching appointments
- 68 established research and service centers

Technology Transfer

- 3rd in Patent Pipeline Power of All Universities in Life Sciences (*The Scientist, June 2005*)
- 136 patents awarded over the last 3 years; 552 active patents
- 63 spin-off companies and 13,000 jobs based on faculty research
- 9th among U.S. universities in patent production, quality and strength (*IEEE Spectrum, Nov. 2006*)
